Jews believe God is going to send a saviour – the Messiah, to make the world as it should be. However, Orthodox and Reform Jews interpret this differently.



Messiah: "the anointed one"; a leader of the Jews who is expected to live on earth at some time in the future

Messianic age: a future time of global peace when everyone will want to become closer to God, possibly through the intervention of the Messiah

- Fully understand and observe the Mitzvot
- A charismatic leader
- A judge

- One whom world leaders will go to for advice

- Will bring in the Messianic Age


