Messiah Judaism Beliefs & Teachings

Messiah: "the anointed one"; a leader of the Jews who is expected to live on earth at some time in the future

He will

- Rebuild the **Temple** in Jerusalem
- Gather **all of Israel** together
- Bring about world peace
- **Everyone** will worship God
- the dead will be resurrected

Need to know his nature (what he is like)

- Sent by God
- Born of human parents
- A descendent of King David
- Fully understand and observe the Mitzvot. Very religious
- A charismatic leader
- A judge
- One whom world leaders will go to for advice
- Will bring in the Messianic Age

Messianic age: a future time of global peace when everyone will want to become closer to God, possibly through the intervention of the Messiah

'I will put my **sanctuary** among them forever.' *In the Tanakh it says*

'Even if you have been banished to the most distant land under the heavens, from there the Lord your God will gather you and bring you back.' In the Tanakh it says

'He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples. They will beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore.' In the Tanakh it says

The Lord will be king over the whole earth. On that day there will be one Lord, and his name the only name. In the Tanakh it says

Jews believe God is going to send a Messiah, to make the world as it should be.

Possible Questions

The belief in the Messiah Influences...

- **influences** Jews to believe that the Messiah will be special and close to God.
