<ul> <li><u>The festival of Pesach demonstrates</u></li> <li><u>God's omnipotence</u> and <u>omnibenevolence</u>: The power and inclination shown in rescuing his people from slavery</li> <li>The hardship the Jews have faced in the past but will be saved and redeemed if they remain faithful: can help in recent times of trouble and persecution (<i>influence</i>)</li> <li>Marks the beginning of their journey to the Promised Land which remains a key concept for Jews today</li> <li>Confirms Moses as a key figure in Jewish history and fighting for the faith</li> <li>Leads onto the Covenant at Sinai in which Moses is given the 10 Commandments</li> </ul>


